HONESTY REVIVAL

As a nation, we stand in desperate need for a revival in the ways of honesty. So, in a practical way, let me suggest the following five steps toward that end:

1. Learn Bible principles that relate to honesty. In the context of making false vows, Jesus said, "But let your statement be, 'Yes, yes' or 'No, no'; anything beyond these is of evil" (Mt. 5:37). Paul wrote the brethren in Ephesus, saying, "Therefore, laying aside falsehood, speak truth each one of you with his neighbor, for we are members of one another" (Eph. 4:25). There are many such verses in the Bible. Make your own list of references and refer to it often. Nothing can change bad habits like a good working knowledge of God's word.

2. Set the right example of honesty before others. A good example of honesty is vital in the home; but it is essential also if we hope to influence friends and neighbors. The power of a good example can hardly be understated. Make sure your life is a good example of honesty.

3. Encourage and expect honesty from others. This is especially important for children. If you make a promise, be sure to keep it (Ps. 15:4). Don't ask your children to lie for you. Don't cheat on business transactions. Be humble enough to admit when you have made a mistake and ask for forgiveness.

4. Be willing to confront dishonesty in others. This does not mean that we have to be contentious or nit-picky. It means when you hear facts, people, or issues misquoted, politely correct the mistake. This makes others aware of their own honesty; but it must be done with kindness. No one likes to be attacked or have everything called into question. Diplomatic confrontation is one way Christians can influence the morality of the peoples around us.

5. Make honesty a prayer-priority. We tend to be more conscious of things for which we continually pray. Ask God to help you keep truth and fiction separated in your mind and in your conversation. Ask Him to help you keep your word. It used to be said, "A man's word is his bond." We need to restore that level of verbal integrity. Commit yourself to a new level of honesty in every aspect of your life. You will be better for it and the world a better place in which to live.


