“SIT AND SPIN”

Spinning has long been one of America’s favorite pastimes. Long before the days of video games and techno-toys, children could be amused for hours with an exciting toy known quite simply as the “top.” Similarly, before the days of battery-powered miniature cars and trucks, our children used to find great enjoyment sitting on what looked like a little, round picnic table with a larger seating than table area. The freewheeling base provided movement while the rigid support area in the middle enabled the child to hold on and spin like crazy. Appropriately named, “Sit and Spin”, this toy, like the top, may soon become a relic of the past.

Wouldn’t it be nice if the spin doctors of our day would put away their toys and begin a sincere quest for truth? So much of what we hear these days is an inaccurate reflection of reality. In an increasingly pluralistic society, people are crying out for absolutes. We have grown weary of “sit and spin” philosophies which offer no direction or purpose. More and more people are becoming sick of washed-out, milk toast religionists who refuse to take a stand on moral issues. There will always be those “who call evil good, and good evil” (Is. 5:20). But, we must not be intimidated by ridicule or cower to pressure. Truth is truth. Our mission is to live it, support it, and proclaim it. Truth is revealed in God’s word and will stand the test of time. (Jn. 17:17; Mt. 24:35). Truth must not be clouded by worldly philosophy but courageously upheld as that which liberates us from the power and penalty of sin (Jn. 8:32).

As long as the Lord delays in His return, there will be those who “sit and spin” and those who follow along in their meaningless pursuit. Even in the church there will be those who “turn away their ears from the truth” and seek out “teachers in accordance with their own desires” (2 Tim. 4:3-4). Spinning is their business, but it doesn’t have to be ours. What they are spinning is a web of deceit into which the unwary fall. They promise would-be disciples; that they are the ones who are really going places. However, we must not confuse movement with direction. They are moving, but they are going nowhere. Even stagnant water will get moving if you pull the plug and send it down the drain!

Our movement must be the purposeful and deliberate movement that comes as a result of following Jesus who is “the way, and the truth, and the life.” Make no mistake about it—no one will come to the Father but through Him! (Jn. 14:6). Thank God for the purpose, direction, and peace of mind which comes in knowing that His way is the right way—the only way!


